

Miss Teresa's *Magical* Travel Pillowcase



This pillowcase fits a 12" x 16" pillow

Fabric Requirements (for 1 pillowcase)

Section:	Buy this much:	Cut to this size:
Body	1/2 yard	17-1/2" x 27"
Accent	1/8 yard	2-1/2" x 27"
Cuff	1/4 yard	7-1/2" x 27"

You will also need a sewing machine, basic sewing supplies and coordinating thread. Having an iron and pressing surface nearby will make the process go much faster.

Directions:

Step 1: Press your fabric.

Step 2: Cut fabric sections to measurements specified in the grid.

Step 3: Fold accent strip in half lengthwise and press.

Step 4: Prep your fabric roll-up!

- (a) Place the cuff fabric right side up.
- (b) Position accent strip on top of cuff fabric so that the raw edges meet along the top edge of the cuff fabric.
- (c) Lay body piece face down on top of other two fabrics. Align raw edges at top and pin.
- (d) Roll up body piece and stop 3" away from pinned edge.
- (e) Wrap lower edge of cuff fabric over rolled up body piece and meet at upper edges. *(Make sure the body fabric roll doesn't get caught up in the pinned fabrics.)*
- (f) Sew, using a 1/4" seam allowance, backstitching to secure both ends of seam.

Step 5: Make magic. Reach inside and pull the body roll, turning the work right side out. Press. *(Square up ends if needed.)*

Step 6: Fold pillowcase wrong sides together matching accent strip, cuff and lower edges. Pin. Starting at top of the cuff, sew along the two sides using a 1/4" seam allowance.

Step 7: Trim corners first, then trim seam allowances to 1/8", Turn pillowcase inside out, pushing out corners with a point turner. Press.

Step 8: Sew again, using a 1/4" seam allowance. Turn pillowcase inside out, pushing out corners with a point turner. Press.

Look Mom - no raw edges because you made a French seam!
